Within the two-year EU co-funded project, "Together: Working in partnership with children and youth to enhance their rights in responses to crisis situations such as Covid-19 and other emergencies," SOS Children's Villages has worked to empower children and young people living in vulnerable family situations and in alternative care to participate meaningfully in decisions and solutions at local, regional, and national level on all matters affecting them, including in times of emergency.
