In line with realising SDG 16.2, and following the adoption of the EU Child Rights Strategy, this is a key moment to hear the voices of children and young people and to address the changes needed at policy, organisational and individual level in order to better support children and young people impacted by peer violence.

Applying Safe Behaviours: Preventing and Responding to Peer Violence FINAL PROJECT EVENT – CONCEPT NOTE 24.04.2023, Brussels

Peer on peer violence is one of the most common ways that children and young people experience violence. Globally, 1 in 3 students aged 13-15 experience bullying¹.

In order to realize SDG 16.2, which aims at a world free from violence against children by 2030, it is important to scale up simple but effective interventions that equip children, young people, and the adults who care for and work with them to make a difference and create a safer environment around them. We believe that the activities implemented within the "Applying Safe Behaviours" project are a good example of how this can be achieved.

However, adequately responding to situations of violence also requires stronger policy and institutional frameworks that enable effective responses to be activated. The past years have been marked by a significant political momentum to set an ambitious agenda to end violence against children and catalyse political and financial investments to support the realization of SDG 16.2.

At the EU level, the adoption in 2021 of the EU Child Rights strategy, which outlines actions for combating violence against children and ensuring child protection among key thematic areas, has contributed to further build momentum around that agenda. In particular, the commitment to present an initiative to support the development and strengthening of integrated child protection systems is very promising and carries the potential to set out a new course in the way different actors address the protection challenges children face.

In light of these policy developments, this is a key moment to discuss the need for urgently translating commitments into tangible actions and ensure all EU Member States set ambitious targets in order to tackle violence experienced by children in the most vulnerable groups.

About "Applying Safe Behaviours"

Using information provided by children and young people, the EU co-funded project "Applying Safe Behaviours" has developed a series of capacity building and awareness-raising interventions which explore some of the reasons why they think peer on peer violence happens, where it happens, what they think would help prevent and protect them from peer violence, and what they would like adults to consider when supporting those affected by it.

A key objective of the project has been to make children and young people active agents in creating a safe environment for themselves and their peers. It is important to highlight that peer on peer violence happens everywhere and that factors in the wider environment in which children and young people live can heighten the risk of being affected, whether they are a target, initiator, or witness to the violence.

This project has also focused on enabling adults to prevent peer on peer violence and respond appropriately in cases where it does happen. This requires developing a multi-sectoral approach in which everyone involved has a shared understanding of the issues and the role they should play. As a first step, we invite everybody to invest one hour to go through this short e-learning on what peer on peer violence is and how you can support children and young people affected by it.

- ✓ A set of policy recommendations on what key changes are needed in order to prevent peer violence and create a safe environment among children and young people, and to improve the response and support they receive when impacted by peer on peer violence, will be disseminated.
- Participants will discuss and commit to how they will take the recommendations forward to turn them into concrete actions.
