The report explores how SOS Children's Villages Benin has organized and operates ICT4D initiatives and projects on a national level. These initiatives have enabled children and young people participating in SOS Children's Villages' Alternative Care and Family Strengthening Programmes to build their digital capacities, strengthen their social integration, improve their employability and provide them access to various other opportunities.

THE AIM OF ICT4D PROJECTS

The implementation of ICT4D projects in Benin was driven with the goal in mind of reducing the digital divide between children and young people from and outside of the target group. It has subsequently allowed those who live without adequate parental care to be put on equal footing.

THE IMPLEMENTATION OF ICT4D PROJECTS

The process started with children and young people from the target group acquiring basic IT skills. This sparked the development and integration of various ICT4D initiatives and projects explained in this report: Digital Village, Digital Learning for Digital Generation (DLDG), YouthLinks Community, Learnio, ICDL and Telemedicine.




Including young people in the decision-making processes regarding the digitalization of programmes was a top priority as it ensured the correct and relevant implementation of solutions.




RESULTS & IMPACT


Advancement of digital skills 10 years and older




Capacity to generate income (employability) 15 years and older
